

2022 Men's Senior League Event Descriptions

Best 1-2-3 Team Better Ball

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this team event. 1 of 4 better balls are used on par 5's, 2 of 4 better balls are used on par 4's, and 3 of 4 better balls are used on par 3's. The team with the lowest net score wins.

Best 2 of 4 Better Ball

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this team event. The best 2 of 4 net scores** on each hole is used to determine the team total. The team with the lowest score wins.

Best 2 of 4 Low Net**

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this team event. The best 2 of 4 net scores** for 9 holes determine the team total. The team with the lowest score wins.

Best 3 of 4 Better Ball

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this team event. The best 3 of 4 net scores** on each hole is used to determine the team total. The team with the lowest score wins.

Best 3 of 4 Horserace Points

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this team event. The best 3 of 4 net horserace points on each hole is used to determine the team total. Points are awarded for the net score on each hole: Net Bogey -1 point, Net Par -2 points, Net Birdie -3 points, Net Eagle -4 points. The team with the most points wins.

BIG CUP Events

Team or individual events played with special 6" cups.

Birdie Shoot-Out

Handicaps are used for this individual event. Birdies count for 1 point, eagles for 2. Players with the most points win.

4-Man Best Shot

All four players tee off, and the best shot is selected. Players continue to select the best shot of the 4 balls until the ball is holed. Handicaps are used to pair players in foursomes, not for tournament play. A-B-C-D players are paired together, based on handicap, to form a team. The team with the lowest score wins.

• Variation – When declared by tournament rules, the golfer whose drive is selected <u>does not</u> play the 2nd shot.

3-Man Best Shot

All three players tee off, and the best shot is selected. Players continue to select the best shot of the 3 balls until the ball is holed. Handicaps are used to pair players in foursomes, not for tournament play. A-B-C-D players are paired together, based on handicap, to form a team. The team with the lowest score wins.

• Variation – When declared by tournament rules, the golfer whose drive is selected <u>does not</u> play the 2nd shot.

Individual Horserace Points

Handicaps are used for this individual event. Points are awarded for the net score on each hole: Net Bogey -1 point, Net Par -2 points, Net Birdie -3 points, Net Eagle -4 points. The players with the most points win.

President's Better Ball

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this team event. The best 2 of 4 net scores** are used on par 4's and the best 3 of 4 net scores are used on par 3's and par 5's. The team with the lowest score wins.

Shamble

100% of handicaps are used for this team event. All players hit their drives and the best drive is selected. From that point each player plays their own ball until holed. The event is typically scored with either 2 or 3 scores counting on each hole.

Shoot-Out

The 19 low qualifiers qualify to play, with 10 in a group starting on hole # 1 and 9 in a group starting on hole #2 at 1:00 pm Thursday, September 27. Based on net scores, one player drops out of the Shoot-Out on each hole. When needed, chip-offs from 10-20 yards will break ties. Chip-off winners will be those players chipping closest to the hole with one shot.

Qualifying for the Shoot-Out can be done anytime from August 23rd - September 23rd, simply inform the Golf Shop staff and pay the \$3 qualifying entry fee before play. **3- Pack**

All players play each hole with their own ball, handicaps are used for this 4-man team event. 1 better ball of 4 is used for the first 3 holes, 2 better balls of 4 are used for the second 3 holes, and 3 better balls of 4 are used for the final 3 holes.

<u>Throw Out High Hole</u> Individual stroke play with handicap. Each player's high gross score is subtracted from the nine hole net score.

** Net Scores – Refers to a player's score, less handicap strokes received. Net scores may be based on a hole (Example: An actual score of 5, less 1 handicap stroke receive, equals a net score of 4) or by a total (Example: An actual 9 hole score of 50, less a 9hole handicap of 12, equals a 9 hole net score of 38).
