WHEREAS, the City of Rochester acknowledges the historical and current contributions of the Black community to the health and wellness of our community; and

WHEREAS, the NAACP Rochester Minnesota branch is hosting a virtual "Black History Month Speaker Series" every Saturday in February; and on February 1st, the City Hall dome lights were lit with red, green, and yellow.
