

Student Art Opportunity

In preparation for Fire Prevention Week in October (6th-12th 2024), the Rochester Fire Department invites all students **PreK through Grade 8** to submit their original artwork for display at the five Rochester fire houses this fall.

This year's theme for Fire Prevention Week is "**Smoke alarms: Make them work for you.**" Artwork should reflect the theme, fire prevention in general, or getting to know your local fire department.

Artwork should follow these guidelines:

- Visual art on paper
- Designed for hanging on wall
- Maximum Size: 12 inches by 18 inches
- Labeled clearly on the back with Name, Grade, School, and Teacher
- Optional: may use media attached securely to the paper (e.g., yarn, foil, macaroni, etc.)

Submission Deadline: October 7th 2024

The Rochester Fire Department will display artwork for community viewing at three Fire Prevention Week events -- **October 9th (5:30-7:30pm), 11th (5:30-7:30pm), and 12th (9-11am)**. They will select a number of artworks for permanent display at fire stations across Rochester.

Schools & Stations

Each fire station will host art from several RPS schools:

- **Station 1 – 521 Broadway Ave. S:** Lincoln, Riverside, Washington, Longfellow, John Adams
- **Station 2 – 2185 Wheelock Dr NE:** Churchill, Hoover, Jefferson, Kellogg
- **Station 3 – 2755 2nd St. SW:** Bishop, Sunset Terrace, Folwell, Bamber Valley
- **Station 4 – 1875 41st St NW:** Gibbs, Overland, Gage, Elton Hills, Dakota
- **Station 5 – 305 28th St. SE:** Franklin, Mighty Oaks, Willow Creek

Notes to Parents

- *Families of children who do not attend an RPS school may drop artwork off at Northrop Education Center, 201 8th Street Northwest, before October 7th 2024.*
- *Students may pick up their artwork on the final Fire Prevention Week display (October 12) at the fire station associated with their school.*
